# “Moving the Cats” - A Response

## **Viable:**

- **Able to be done or worth doing**

(Encarta World English Dictionary)

- **Financially sustainable**

(Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary, 11<sup>th</sup> edition)

# “Moving the Cats” - A Response

When considering viability, we need to ask two questions:

- Are visual resources viable to the institution? – speaking of higher education.
- If so, then how does the institution make Visual Resources positions viable for the professional?

# “Moving the Cats” - A Response

Visual resources are viable where:

- 1) They are strongly supported by faculty.
- 2) Services are user centered.
- 3) There are sufficient resources (budgets, equipment, technical support).
- 4) There are positive collaborations and good relationships.

# “Moving the Cats” - A Response

To effectively perform duties, the visual resources professional must have:

- 1) Appropriate status – same status as librarians,
- 2) Meaningful budget lines,
- 3) Adequate resources: equipment, technical assistance, and
- 4) Professional development support

Our viability lies in:

- Collaborating with our partners
- Discovering hidden values AND articulating them
- Advocating visual resources
- Making current positions competitive
